Many of you know Brian Doornenbal through either his many years teaching at Edmonton Christian School and/or his work with The Prairie Centre for Christian Education. Just over two years ago, Brian was diagnosed with multiple myeloma, a blood cancer, and part of his treatment was a bone marrow transplant which severely impacts a person’s immune system. The current situation with Covid-19 is particularly serious for people in Brian’s context and as such his recent Twitter post is a great reminder for all of us of what it can mean to LOVE others: *Those who protest wearing a mask b/c they feel it is the gov't taking away their personal freedom are forgetting that the only real freedom comes when we love others. It is what we are created and commanded to do. Having the mind of Christ compels us to put others first.*

## LEADING

You may have heard in the news that our sister schools in BC are returning to in-person classes in June. We will continue talking with the leaders there and learning from their experiences as they begin the journey that we will walk in September. We'll be compiling the lessons we can learn from BC and others as they begin the transition.

As we begin to look toward September, it is good practice to reflect on the past couple of months and to look for key learnings that can guide us into the next year. This [ARTICLE](#) gives a structure for reflecting, using these questions:

- What was supposed to happen?
- What actually happened?
- Why was there a difference?
- What can we learn from this?

It would be worthwhile to use these questions with your staff, with your leadership team and with the Board to focus the conversation on their specific areas of influence. Connecting with each group will provide the school with a holistic picture of the past and current situation and give insight for the future. When we think about the remote learning aspect, we all recognize that what we've done this spring, is in many ways "emergency remote learning" and what we've done has been remarkable considering the lack of preparation time. If this model continues into next year however, we will want to build and improve upon the lessons we've learned this year as the expectations will be different (higher?) with more prep time and research available.
